CCPEG Downtown Revitalization Master Planning	CCPEG	<p>CCPEG engaged Barton & Loguidice to provide downtown planning and design assistance to assist two local municipalities, Falconer and Westfield, who were both selected through a competitive application process, with preparing area-wide Plans (one Plan for each municipality) that will identify and prioritize future potential projects and funding opportunities., our goal is to create a strategic area-wide master plan and conceptual design plans for their downtown areas that readies them for future implementation funding and a tool for improvements and/or policy modifications. In order to build upon and improve the assets in each community's downtown area, we are advancing area-wide master plan approach that would summarize current resources to build upon, infrastructure and economic development needs, and prioritize a phased suite of future improvements, including preliminary cost estimates for each. Findley Lake Fire Hall Reuse Study	Town of Mina/CCPEG	Plans to relocate the Findley Lake Volunteer Fire Department, in conjunction with the Town of Mina, are currently underway. The Town and Fire Department plan on building a new facility that will house both the fire station and the highway department on donated property. The two-story 1950's fire station structure would be vacated and could easily be renovated to support a variety of uses. <p>1891 Fredonia Opera House Seat Replacement</p>	<p>1891 Fredonia Opera House PAC</p>	<p>The project is the replacement of seating inside the 1891 Fredonia Opera House Performing Arts Center. The current seats, originally installed in 1926, are uncomfortable and no longer meet today's patron expectations. The replacement seats will be larger width, and the new seating layout will include greater distance between rows, where possible, to increase patron leg room. The seats, while contemporary in their width and comfort level, will appear historic in their design and thus blend with the vintage appearance of the theatre. Also, the project includes leveling a rear portion of the orchestra's sloped floor to allow for construction of a wheelchair seating platform. The platform will accommodate up to five wheelchairs and movable companion seats.
